Three Longtime Tribal Librarians Celebrated at NALSIG Meeting

Jeanne Whitehorse, Joyce Medina and Maureen Wacondo were recognized at a special in-person meeting of the Native American Libraries Special Interest Group at the Martha Liebert Library in Bernalillo on September 22nd. The three were presented with commemorative pottery plates made by Sherry Aragon, Acoma potter and director of the Espanola Public Library.

Jeanne Whitehorse served as Tribal Outreach and Program Support Specialist for the New Mexico State Library, working out of Crownpoint. She provided outreach services to Navajo Chapters and other rural libraries, traveling thousands of miles each year. She retired in June after serving in this post for more than twenty years.

Joyce Medina retired after twenty years as librarian for the Zia Enrichment Library. Several of her colleagues from Zia Pueblo attended the meeting, and Zia Education Department Director Marsha Leno noted her many contributions.

Maureen Wacondo left her position this year as librarian at the Jemez Pueblo Community Library & Archives following a long career. She was well-known for her work with children and students in promoting the use of the Towa language.

During the meeting, discussion continued about funding, building and programming and funding using appropriations received through the Tribal Education Initiative in 2022 and 2023. NALSIG Chair Jonna Paden noted that she had been elected as President of the American Indian Library Association of the American Library Association. NALSIG will elect new officers at their November meeting.




